### **Swim Time**


The pool will be open through Labor Day and close at the end of the day Monday, September 5<sup>th</sup>. No lifeguards are on duty. Swim at your own risk. No smoking or alcoholic beverages within the gated area at any time. Running, rough play, or piggy-backing is not allowed within the gated area. Abusive or profane language is not permitted. Persons under the age of 14 must be accompanied by a parent or guardian at least 18 years of age. NO DIVING. Eating or drinking is not allowed in the pool. Glass containers are not allowed anywhere within the gated area. Proper swimwear is required. The Health Department mandates that babies and toddlers must wear swim diapers. Hours: Monday 1 pm – 9 pm, Tuesday – Sunday, 9 am –9 pm. Adults Only Swim 6 am – 8 am Tuesday - Sunday

## **Owner Occupancy**

In 2018, the Castlerock homeowners voted in a new covenant to require that this neighborhood have properties that are occupied by the owner. A few rental properties at the time were grandfathered in, and those property owners have maintained their status by following the requirements. However, no new rental properties can be established now. If a rental property is sold, it must become a home that is owned and lived in by the owner. See the full details on the website.

The warped railroad timbers that had formed the retaining wall for the first 30 years of this neighborhood around the large pond are gone, and have been replaced with aesthetically pleasing concrete pavers. The contractor had many setbacks due to the Pandemic and the resulting supply chain shortages and staffing woes that have beset many companies. # **HOA Message**

Sadly, there was deliberate and costly damage to the pool fence and around the pool house this Spring. The vandalism resulted in extensive repairs being required for the fence, the wiring, and the electronic key system. All told, the unbudgeted expenditures for this repair were more than \$6,000. Due to the damage our pool service company had to rush to open the pool after the fence was safely repaired. Soon after the pool opened, there was another vandalism event where all of the furniture was thrown in the pool, causing the aging filter to succumb to the stress. This was an additional cost of \$1,500. Thank you for your patience as our pool company worked to quickly balance the chemicals and then close the pool again to replace the old filter. Security Cameras will be installed at the pool and monitored by a Board Member for vandalism and entry during times the pool is closed. If you see suspicious activity, please call the police and/or notify Aria.
